

# Company for breakfast

The owner of Springdale Farm Bed and Breakfast aims for a simple country feel.

VICTOR — Think bed and breakfast and you may think lace, Victorian wallpaper or high-backed velvet chairs.

Not so at Springdale Farm Bed and Breakfast on County Road 9.

"We're a homestead," owner Eileen Cash said. One of the two rooms has a country feel. The other, with a Native American theme, makes you think of a lodge, she explained.

Cash wasn't going for the high-end market. She said she tries to price herself with the Hampton Inn and Suites on Route 96, just east of Eastview Mall. Springdale's rooms range from \$100 to \$130, including the gourmet breakfast.

Business had gone well, Cash said, since she opened in May 2005. This past May was her busiest month. Cash had assumed fall would be her busiest season, but she has found that her location appeals to Canadians, Mormons attending Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day

Saints events in nearby Palmyra and Manchester, business travelers, among others.

Cash and her husband bought the 1820 farm, once known as Mott Homestead, in 1999 after happening upon a real estate open house there. It took her a while to convince her husband, but, now, she said, "He loves it. Oh, my gosh, I can't believe it."

He had been concerned about taking in strangers, but as Cash said, "Bed and breakfast people, they're a breed among themselves. They're particular in their personal life and they're particular about where they stay."

## County court

He will be sentenced Aug. 21, and his bail was set at \$20,000 cash/\$40,000 bond.

tenced to five years probation and restitution.

• Ryan Buckley, 27, of 125 Glenview Drive, Clifton Springs, pleaded guilty to criminal possession of stolen property for a March 23 theft at the FYE store in Eastview Mall. Sentencing was adjourned to Aug. 21. Bail was set at \$10,000 cash/\$20,000 bond.

• Michael Chapman, 17, of Terri Drive in Farmington, was sentenced as a youthful offender to five years on probation, 250 hours of community service and restitution. He pleaded guilty in April to felony criminal mischief, which happened in Farmington this past March and involved damage to another person's vehicle.

• David W. Newbould, 35, of Holley in Orleans County, pleaded guilty to felony driving with a suspended or revoked license, driving while ability impaired by drugs, criminal possession of stolen property and reckless driving. The crimes occurred March 1 on County Road 30 in Canandaigua, and involved a stolen vehicle. New-

bould was sentenced as a second-time felon to one and one-half to three years in prison, a \$500 fine and restitution.

• Ryan Beck, 19, of 5875 Yerkes Road in Canandaigua, was sentenced to two to six years in prison. He pleaded guilty March 24 to two counts of rape, two counts of criminal sexual act and endangering the welfare of a child, which occurred in March and May of 2005, involving a person under the age of 15. An order of protection was issued.

• Raymond Robinson, 35, of 2400 Route 21 in Canandaigua, pleaded guilty to a class D felony DWI — which indicates two prior DWI convictions within 10 years — and felony driving with a suspended or revoked license. He was charged March 31 on Route 332 in Farmington and will be sentenced Aug. 22.

• Kenneth Marvin Jr., 20, of 99 Park Ave. in Canandaigua, and Heather Tassie, 24, of 25 Booth St. in Canandaigua, each pleaded innocent to two counts of second-degree robbery, stemming from an incident Feb. 10 in Canandaigua. His bail was set at \$30,000 cash, and hers at \$5,000 cash. Orders of protection were issued.

Also on June 28, Marvin pleaded innocent to burglary, petit larceny and criminal mischief, which allegedly happened Jan 26 on South Main Street. Bail on those charges is also \$30,000 cash, and another order of protection was issued.

Marvin additionally pleaded innocent to burglary and petit larceny charges stemming from a Jan. 30 incident on Clark Street, with bail at \$30,000 cash and another order of protection issued.

Also on June 28, Tassie pleaded innocent to grand larceny and petit larceny, which allegedly happened in May 2005, involving a stolen debit card. Her bail on those charges is \$5,000 cash, and an order of protection is in place.
